5 FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Membership

The HPA's membership year is from 1st January to 31st December. As agreed in the 2019 AGM, the

annual HPA membership subscription was maintained at £10.

There are currently 237 active members and 153 of these had paid their 2019 membership subscriptions by 16th April. Two new members joined during the fiscal year 2019/20 and Malcolm Fletcher agreed to become an honorary member. Two members, who had previously failed to give consent for their details to be held by the HPA, paid their 2020 membership subscription and have been reinstated.

Finances

£1,890.47 was raised from HPA members' subscriptions during the 2019/20 fiscal year: 22.5% in 2019 and 77.5% in 2020. Direct bank transfers plus two cheques raised £1,590 and £300.47 was raised via PayPal. PayPal provides a convenient method of payment but difficulties accessing the HPA account with inadequate support from PayPal and charges reduced payments by 6.1% and raised the possibility of stopping PayPal payments. Fortunately, the problem accessing the HPA account corrected itself by the end of the fiscal year.
